Three quarters of a million pounds raised for Namibian Projects!

This astonishing milestone was passed in May this year, a true testament to all the support we have had over the last twenty-two years and continue to receive for which the Foundation is truly grateful.



The places in boxes are the locations of the Foundation's projects.

Since the Foundation's launching in 2005, having previously been Catherine's Memorial Fund, it has improved the lives of rural Namibians with regards to Education, Health and provision of fresh water. Over the years with your support, we have accomplished the following in the Omaheke Region.

Otjimanangombe and Omuhaturua Primary School and Hostel

The re-equipping of a borehole to provide freshwater for the school and hostel.

The construction of a Primary Healthcare Clinic and nurses' accommodation

The provision of a fully equipped ambulance

The donation of 75 goats to the San Bushmen and their families.

Otjimanangombe and Omuhaturua Primary School and Hostel (continued)

The donation of twenty sheep to the school to teach the children animal husbandry.

The construction of a formal kitchen and covered seating area for the hostel.

The purchase of 250 mattresses for the hostel dormitories

The conversion of a building into hostel dormitories for girls and boys and the construction of flush toilets for girls and boys.

The re-equipping of a borehole with solar panels and a pump for the school, hostel and clinic,

The provision of a fully equipped ambulance to replace the original vehicle which had reached the end of its operational. This new vehicle is permanently based at the clinic.

The construction of a multi-purpose hall for the school and hostel

Eiseb Primary School and Hostel

The construction of a forty-bed dormitory to relieve chronic overcrowding in the hostel.

The construction of a formal kitchen and large covered seating area for the hostel.

The repair of the sewage and drainage system to allow the school and hostel toilets and showers to be fully utilised.

The purchase of 150 sets of uniforms for the children of the San Bushmen families.

The provision of an irrigation system in a large school garden to provide produce for the hostel kitchen and for families in need.

Donkerbos Primary School and hostel

The drilling and equipping of a borehole to bring freshwater to the school for the first time.

The renovation of the showers and toilets which could not used until we had drilled the borehole.

The Foundation purchased 120 mattresses for the hostel dormitories

OUR CURRENT PROJECT – to provide school uniforms for 89 boys and 115 girls and 218 pairs of shoes and socks. The School Principal has also asked if we can provide 200 spoons for the children to eat their meals with.

AND NOW TO THE OSHIKOTO REGION – NORTHERN NAMIBIA

The Catherine Bullen Primary Healthcare Clinic, Oshivelo

On 23 August 2002, our daughter Catherine, died in the foremer clinic at Oshivelo from severe gastro enteritis. The clinic was not fit for purpose.

In 2008, the clinic that the Foundation built in Otjimanangombe was opened by the then Minister of Health, Dr Richard Kamwi. He announced that a new clinic and nurses' accommodation would be built by the Government to cater for the population of Oshivelo and its surrounding settlements, tourists and those traveling on the main road from Windhoek to the north. It would be named after Catherine in recognition of the Foundation's work in Namibia.

On 16 July 2014, the clinic was also opened by the Minister of Health Dr Richard Kamwi. We attended the opening and we have supported the clinic ever since. This year the Foundation repaired the toilets and showers and replaced three rotten exterior doors. The hot water system was also decalcified resulting in the hot water system working again after a period of a year being down. This year marks its tenth anniversary, and we will be attending a celebratory party at the beginning of November.

Another one of our current projects is to provide the clinic with a permanent ambulance and the Foundation is funding a refurbishment of a vehicle and equipping it with emergency equipment.



This is the ambulance that the Foundation is refurbishing. It is currently having a new engine fitted.





Every penny raised has been used to fund the projects. The Foundation has no overheads except for the necessary public liability insurance. It is also worth repeating that all our trips are self-financed with no charitable money being used for this purpose.

A wheelchair for a Grandma

A friend of ours in Gobabis, Henk Olwage posted on Facebook that he was urgently seeking a wheelchair for a Grandma named Katrina Geelbooi, a San Bushman lady who was currently bedridden. The Foundation felt this was something it could provide and funds have recently been transferred for this purpose.

Henk is a pastor in Gobabis and very active supporting the San community there and runs an organisation called 'Light for the Children' which has a school for San children.
